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UP THE BEARS

A very warm welcome is extended to everyone at the Cleric Stadium today and particularly to the players, officials and supporters of Atherton Collieries who have made the trip for this afternoon's Isuzu FA Trophy First Qualifying Round match.

Our struggle to hit the standards set in this season's opening 45 minutes of our first match (in the FA Cup) continued on Tuesday here against Wythenshawe in the NPL Division One West.

We were defensively sound but were unable to create openings against a similarly well organised defence. The same applied to Wythenshawe, as the Bears thwarted their attempts to impose themselves in the match. Both goalkeepers had to pull off one dangerous shot as first Dave Parton reacted quickly to push a close-range header over the bar before the Wythenshawe 'keeper made an outstanding save from Joe Woolley's cleverly placed clip from just outside the area that was heading for the top corner before a fingertip save pushed the ball onto the crossbar and back into play before being hacked clear. Other than that, chances were at a premium and overall, the 0-0 draw pretty well summed up the game.

Atherton Collieries had a busy summer period recruiting several good players and have had an unusual opening 6 games of the season. The first was at home in the FA cup and was drawn.

There followed 5 consecutive home games including 2 wins in the FA Cup and 1 in the FA Trophy so remain in both competitions – hence their visit to the Cleric Stadium today. Of the league games all at home, was a 2-4 defeat by Mossley, a 1-0 win against Hanley Town and last Tuesday a 1-0 defeat by Padiham. That leaves them in 17th spot in the league table, 1 place above the Bears. Last season the Colls had the edge over the Bears, winning 4-2 at home and drawing 0-0 here. Every meeting between the sides has been closely a fought affair and nothing currently indicates that today's match will be any different.

It was good to see Owen Morris return from injury on Tuesday. Similarly, Julius Ndene had benefited from a 1 match rest, and Darren Chadwick had returned from holiday, although Darren was an unused substitute. Finally, Kieran Garner-Knapper has served his suspension and is available for selection today. These four players will give the squad and Richard Duffy a boost with their return to action. The Bears will desperately be seeking to turn some strong defensive showings into victories and as this is an FA Trophy match, there will be a result today.

If the scores are level at the end of normal time, the game will go straight to penalties. The winners will pocket £1500.00 and the losers £400.00. The second qualifying round will be drawn after the weekend with ties scheduled for Saturday 12th September and prize money of £2250.00 for the winners and £575.00 for the losers. That in itself is a real incentive for both clubs today.

Our next match is away on Bank Holiday Monday 31st August ko 3.00pm as we travel to Kidsgrove Athletic. Then, as we anticipated the match against Prescott Cables on Saturday 5th September has been moved to Tuesday 8th September ko 7:45pm as Prescott Cables are in the FA Cup on the 5th. We now have no game on Saturday 5th September.

The Bears have a bye in the Cheshire Senior Cup First Round.



We hope everyone here enjoys the match and importantly, stays safe and has a safe journey home.

PLAYING SQUAD 2026/27:

David Parton | Goalkeeper

Dave has been a central figure in some of the most memorable moments of Congleton's recent history. The former Stoke City goalkeeper has also represented Nantwich Town, Kidsgrove Athletic and Whitchurch Alport. He joined the Bears in 2020 and has since passed 200 appearances, combining reliable handling and shot-stopping with a particular reputation for saving penalties. Parton played in the sides that reached the FA Vase semi-final, won the Cheshire Senior Cup and Macron Cup double in 2023, and secured the Midland League title in 2024. He brings continuity, experience and a calm presence to Richard Duffy's squad.

Matthew Liptrott

Jack Bates | Defender

Jack joined Congleton in August 2025 after leaving Wigan Athletic, where he developed through the Latics' academy system. A young, energetic defender, he quickly established himself during his first season at the Cleric Stadium and demonstrated the versatility contributing defensively in the full back and center half roles. His academy background gave him a strong technical and tactical grounding, while a full campaign in senior non-league football added valuable experience of the demands of the Northern Premier League. Returning for a second season with the Bears, Bates offers mobility, composure and further potential to develop within Richard Duffy's rebuilt squad.

Darren Chadwick | Defender

A highly experienced and dependable member of the Bears squad, Darren has represented Congleton since 2021. Comfortable at the heart of the defence and a regular threat from set pieces, 'Chadders' also has the composure to take responsibility from the penalty spot. He made 30 appearances and scored three goals during 2025/26, following several seasons as an important part of Richard Duffy's side. His Congleton career includes the 2023 Cheshire Senior Cup and Macron Cup double, the 2024 Midland League championship and the 2025 NPL West play-off campaign. Darren's leadership, defensive strength and eye for an important goal remain valuable assets.

THE BEARS

PLAYING SQUAD 2026/27:

Richard Duffy | Player-manager / Defender

Richard's playing appearances have become rarer over time as he focuses more on his work on the touchline and leading the football management of the club. He occasionally utilises his experience to step into the defence when required. The former Wales international enjoyed a long Football League career with Swansea City, Portsmouth, Coventry City, Millwall, Exeter City and Port Vale before moving into non-league football. Since taking charge at Congleton, he has overseen an FA Vase semi-final, the Cheshire Senior Cup and Macron Cup double, the 2023/24 Midland League title and a run to the NPL West play-off final. His standards, tactical knowledge and understanding of the game continue to shape the squad.

Marco Fregapane | Right-back

A familiar and popular face returns to the Cleric Stadium. Marco rejoined Congleton during the summer of 2026 after spending the previous season with Welsh Premier side Connah's Quay Nomads, where he gained experience in a full-time, top-flight environment. Still a young defender, he had already made more than 100 first-team appearances for the Bears before leaving in 2025 and became a firm supporters' favourite through his energy, commitment and attacking runs from right-back. Nicknamed the 'Sicilian Bulldog', Marco now returns with broader experience and an even stronger understanding of what it means to represent his hometown club.

Matthew Liptrott | Full-back / Midfielder

Matthew returns for a second season at Congleton after joining the Bears in 2025. A product of Blackpool's academy, he gained early senior experience on loan with Stalybridge Celtic and Radcliffe before continuing his development in non-league football. Able to play at full-back or in midfield, he brings pace, athleticism and useful flexibility to the squad. His first year at the Cleric Stadium allowed him to establish himself at Northern Premier League level and build an effective partnership on the right side of the Bears defence. At 23, Liptrott combines a strong academy education with significant room for further progression.

Owen Morris | Defender

Owen joined Congleton in the summer of 2024 after moving from South Wales to pursue his football ambitions in England. A composed and mobile defender, he played his part in the Bears' run to the 2025 NPL West play-off final before making 15 appearances and scoring once during an injury-disrupted 2025/26 campaign. Comfortable carrying the ball and contributing to the build-up from the back, Owen offers Richard Duffy a different defensive profile as well as the flexibility to operate in more than one role. He enters his third season at the Cleric Stadium looking to further establish himself and continue his development.

Julius Ndene | Defender

Julius is a new addition for 2026/27 after joining the Bears from Leek Town. Born in Stockport, the 23-year-old defender arrives with Northern Premier League experience and has already impressed during pre-season with his calmness in possession and composed approach to defending. Athletic and comfortable on the ball, he adds youth, mobility and competition to Richard Duffy's defensive options. His performances in the summer fixtures earned positive reviews from the club supporters and provided an early indication of how he can contribute at the Cleric Stadium. The coming campaign will be Julius's first season in Congleton colours.

THE BEARS

PLAYING SQUAD 2026/27:

Shakeel Jones-Griffiths | Central midfielder

Shakeel returns to Congleton for a second spell after playing in the Northern Premier League Premier Division with Hyde United. He came through Bolton Wanderers' youth system and has also represented Glossop North End and Bury, as well as passing 100 appearances during his time with Hyde. A powerful and technically capable central midfielder, he brings energy, ball-winning ability and experience from a higher level. Supporters will remember his contribution during his earlier spell with the Bears, including a goal in the club's 2022/23 FA Vase run. Now 26, 'Shak' returns as a more experienced and rounded player.

Theo Knight | Attacking midfielder / Winger

Theo arrives at the Cleric Stadium following an impressive 2025/26 season with Whitchurch Alport. The 21-year-old attacking midfielder can operate centrally or from a wide position and has earned a reputation for direct running, creativity and the ability to produce spectacular goals. His performances in Shropshire attracted attention and made him one of Richard Duffy's notable summer additions. Still at an early stage of his senior career, Theo offers pace and unpredictability in the final third and will be looking to translate his strong form at Step 5 into the Northern Premier League with the Bears.

Daniel Needham | Midfielder / Forward

One of the defining players of Congleton's recent era, Dan passed 200 appearances for the Bears during 2025/26. A dynamic attacking midfielder who can play in several forward roles, 'BGDN' has repeatedly delivered on major occasions. His goals were central to the FA Vase semi-final run, the 2023 cup double and the 2023/24 Midland League title-winning season, when he finished as the club's leading league scorer with 21 goals. Needham combines relentless energy with intelligent movement and a genuine goal threat. His experience and understanding of Richard Duffy's methods make him a particularly important link between the established squad and this summer's new arrivals.

Dallas Omoruyi | Winger

Dallas earned his move to Congleton after impressing throughout the 2026 pre-season programme. The winger spent part of his development with Stockport County before gaining senior experience in non-league football. Quick, direct and eager to attack defenders, he gives the Bears another option in the wide areas and has already shown his ability to get into scoring positions, finding the net during the summer victory over Abbey Hulton United. This will be Dallas's first competitive season at the Cleric Stadium, and his pace and willingness to run at opponents should add a fresh dimension to Richard Duffy's attacking options.

João Soares | Midfielder

Portuguese midfielder João joined the Bears after catching the eye during the 2026 pre-season schedule. The 23-year-old was most recently with Daisy Hill and arrives with the opportunity to establish himself at Northern Premier League level. Comfortable receiving the ball and linking play through midfield, he adds a different technical profile to Richard Duffy's squad. His pre-season performances showed enough quality and composure to earn a place in the group ahead of the new campaign. This will be João's first season at Congleton, and he will be looking to build quickly on the promising impression he made during the summer.

THE BEARS

PLAYING SQUAD 2026/27:

Peter Williams | Midfielder

Pete returns to the Bears for another spell after a very brief fling over the summer at another local club. Previously reaching the landmark of 200 Congleton appearances. Pete is a composed and versatile midfielder that has been an important part of the club's most successful recent period, contributing to the FA Vase semi-final run, the Cheshire Senior Cup and Macron Cup triumphs and the 2023/24 Midland League championship. His quality from set pieces and the penalty spot has produced several significant moments, including successful shoot-out kicks in both 2023 cup finals. 'Willo' brings experience, calmness in possession and a deep understanding of Richard Duffy's standards and the culture of the club.

Kieran Garner-Knapper | Forward

Kieran enters his third season with the Bears after joining during the summer of 2024. The energetic forward has worked his way up through the non-league pyramid and brought that same hunger to the Cleric Stadium. Capable of playing across the front line, he presses defenders, runs the channels and provides a direct attacking outlet. Kieran made 40 appearances and scored five goals during 2025/26, underlining his importance to the squad during a demanding campaign. His pace, work rate and ability to stretch opponents continue to make him a valuable part of Richard Duffy's attacking plans

Matthew Gillam | Forward

Matty begins his third season at Congleton after joining the club in 2024. A product of Rochdale's academy, he made 20 Football League appearances for the Dale and gained experience with Stalybridge Celtic and Cork City before spells at Guiseley, Atherton Collieries and Glossop North End. Strong, mobile, willing to work across the front line with exception technical ability, he can lead the attack or operate in support of another striker. His professional background and experience across several levels give Richard Duffy a proven and adaptable forward option as the Bears prepare for the new campaign.

Dylan Scott | Forward

Dylan joins the Bears with Football League experience and an impressive development pedigree. The Stone-born striker progressed through Burton Albion's academy, made his League One debut in 2024 and scored his first senior goal in the EFL Trophy. Productive loan spells with Hanley Town were followed by experience at Mickleover, Leek Town, Stalybridge Celtic and Stafford Rangers. An energetic, hard-working forward who presses from the front and attacks space, Dylan has already opened his Congleton account during pre-season. At 20, he combines senior experience with considerable potential and adds pace and intensity to the Bears' forward line.

Robert Stevenson | Centre-forward

Rob arrives at Congleton as one of the most proven forwards in the division. A former Stoke City youth player, the Stoke-on-Trent-born striker became a leading figure at Leek Town, scoring more than 100 goals across eight seasons before moving to Hednesford Town in 2024. His progress there was interrupted by a serious head injury, making his return to regular football particularly welcome. Strong, intelligent and experienced in leading a Step 4 attack, Stevenson offers goals, hold-up play and a focal point for the players around him. He joins the Bears ready to begin a new chapter at the Cleric Stadium.

PLAYING SQUAD 2026/27:

Joseph Woolley | Forward

Joe is a new arrival for 2026/27 and brings considerable experience of football across the Northwest and Staffordshire non-league scene. The 30-year-old forward has previously represented Kidsgrove Athletic, Leek Town and Bootle, giving him a strong knowledge of both the division and many of the opponents the Bears will face. Mobile and capable of operating across the attacking line, he adds further competition and flexibility to Richard Duffy's forward options. Joe arrives at the Cleric Stadium at a good stage of his career, combining physical maturity with extensive Step 4 experience and an understanding of the demands of the Northern Premier League.

HOW IT STARTED...

Atherton Collieries Football Club was formed in 1916, by miners from the six pits which were operative in the old urban district of the town. The club was created as a means of providing welfare for those at home during the war effort. When the pits were nationalised, the football club was gifted to the people of the town.

They have played at Alder House since their formation, making the ground one of the oldest in the division. You gain a sense of the history when you walk around the facility which keeps its identity and warmth despite being renovated gradually over the past few years.

Colls were founding members of the North West Counties Football League in 1982 and remained there until 2017, when earned promotion to the Northern Premier League for the first time in the club's history. There have been many memorable moments from the club's time in the NWCFL, and the club are well known around the region as a result.

During the 2006/07 season, Collieries had a future international footballer in their ranks with a young Anthony Pilkington spearheading the Colls attack. Despite being the youngest member of the squad, Pilkington found himself grabbing all the headlines when they beat league leaders FC United of Manchester 3-0 at Gigg Lane. He grabbed himself a hat-trick during this match and soon found himself being transferred straight to the Football League with a move to Stockport County.

From there he went on to move to Huddersfield Town and Norwich City in the Premier League before being called up to the Republic of Ireland's international squad.

Prior to this, Collieries had been known in the local area to produce professional footballers. The famous 1923 FA Cup Final between Bolton Wanderers and West Ham United featured two former Colls players as Billy Butler and Bob Haworth helped the Wanderers bring the FA Cup back to Bolton for the first time in their history.

Links between Bolton Wanderers and Atherton Collieries continue to this very day with the two clubs playing each other in an annual pre-season friendly. Recent clashes have seen over 1,500 walk through the Alder Street turnstiles. Matches like this have helped propel Collieries into the limelight in recent

seasons and fans of various professional football clubs now consider Colls to be their second club.

Michael Clegg was appointed first team manager in August 2014 and immediately began assembling a young and local side. The club went on to win the NWCFL Division One title and the Bolton Hospital Cup in his first season, as well as reaching the final of the League Cup Final and the Division One Cup Final.

Success did not stop there as in his second campaign the Colls went one better and won the League Cup, beating the league champions Colne 5-1 at Fleetwood Town's Highbury Stadium, whilst finishing fourth on the club's return to the North West Counties Premier Division.

The 2016/17 campaign was a momentous one, as in their centenary year they clinched the NWCFL Premier Division title and reached the last 16 of the FA Vase backed by a large and ever growing local fan base. Following their promotion, the Colls defied all odds to proudly win the 2017/18 NPL Challenge Cup within their debut season at Step 4, and went a step beyond by winning the league title to reach the Northern Premier Division in the following campaign.

The club continued to settle to life amongst the Northern Premier League's top rank under the guidance of club icon Brad Cooke, who maintained the club's survival at the highest level in both the town & club's history over a four year stint, with a defensive record that ranked amongst the league's best combined with the club's first serious forays towards winning the Lancashire Trophy, reaching their first final in 2023 following consecutive semi-final outings in 2022 & 2020.

Under the stewardship of David Chadwick in 2023/24, the Stripes were ultimately relegated despite high-scoring and entertaining displays, ending a historic five-year stint in the NPL Premier. Michael Clegg returned to the Dreams2Reality Stadium in September 2024, stabilizing the team's form and a mid table position was realised. Ex Captain Daniel Lafferty took over the management hotseat at the beginning of 2026 having rejoined the club as one of Cleggy's assistants.

Another mid table finish ensued.

Season 26/27 is the club's tenth in the Pitching In NPL. It's been one hell of a ride.

The Daniel Wilkinson Foundation is a charity set up in memory of Daniel Wilkinson who died in 2016 aged 24, while playing the game he loved, from an underlying heart condition called Arrhythmogenic Right Ventricular Cardiomyopathy (ARVC).



Dan played football from an early age and joined Hull City AFC when he was 10, earning a professional contract aged 18. Loughborough University followed where he completed a degree in Accounting and Financial Management while playing non-league football. He was an athlete who enjoyed the gym and took his health and nutrition very seriously. He lived life to the full and had so much ahead of him.

Other than feeling light-headed on a few occasions in the month before he died, he had no symptoms!

SUDDEN CARDIAC DEATH IN THE YOUNG (SCD)

SCD is the leading cause of death in young athletes during sport and the majority of deaths occur with **NO SYMPTOMS** or family history.

ARVC can be found in one in every 1,000 to 5,000 young adults - **IF IT IS LOOKED FOR.**

Warning signs may include light-headedness, fainting, palpitations, swollen legs, breathlessness.

Every week in the UK, 12 apparently fit and healthy young people (aged 35 and under) die from previously undiagnosed heart conditions.

In Italy, where screening is mandatory for all young people engaged in organised sport, they have reduced the incidence of young sudden cardiac death by 89%.

OUR MISSION

The Daniel Wilkinson Foundation has been set up to raise awareness of SCD and to provide funding towards heart screening, defibrillators and CPR/defibrillator training primarily for grass-roots sporting teams.

Tragedies can be prevented through cardiac screening. It is vital that young people are identified and treated.

WHAT IS ANDYSMANCLUB?

ANDYSMANCLUB is a free peer-to-peer group that provides a place for men to come together in a safe and open environment to talk about the issues or problems that they have faced or are currently facing.

HOW DOES IT WORK?

The process is about bringing men together who have been in similar situations, to help each other on a peer to peer basis, sharing how they have dealt with various situations through lived experiences. No matter how big or small your problem feels, we are here to support each other. The 5 questions that are asked each week are designed not only to encourage men to talk, but to start to focus on the positives and on strategies to keep moving forward. There is no pressure to answer any of the questions and it is not uncommon for men to just listen for the first few sessions. The clubs all run on the same format and adhere to the same guidelines. A key principle of ANDYSMANCLUB is anything that is said in the club, stays within the club.

WHO IS IT FOR?

The club is open to any man 18 or over, who is going through a storm, been through a storm or just wants to meet a good group of people with the aim of improving one another.

WHEN IS IT?

ANDYSMANCLUB meet every Monday at 7pm (excluding Bank Holiday Mondays).
