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UP THE BEARS

A very warm welcome is extended to everyone at the Cleric Stadium today and particularly to the players, officials and supporters of Vauxhall Motors who have made the trip for this evening's Pitching In Northern Premier League Division One West match.

This is the opening league fixture of 2026/27 for us after our FA Cup involvement on Saturday. That match, here against AFC Wolverhampton City saw our progress in that competition end abruptly with a 3-2 defeat after leading 2-0 at half time. It was completely baffling to understand how the Bears came to lose a match they were in full control of for the first 45 minutes. The improvement from last season's performances were in evidence as they moved the ball around well, creating several openings and scoring 2 well worked goals from Danny Needham and a fine strike by Shakeel. In the meantime, they restricted their opponents to attacks that in the main were well dealt with and Dave Parton in goal was well protected.

The second half was almost the complete opposite with the Bears failing to pose any real or sustained threat and found themselves being frustrated when looking to up their game. A tale of 2 penalties, both scored, and a failure to deal with a cross in between was some reward for the visitors who never gave up after looking out of the game at half time. The Bears chances were not helped by the dismissal of Kieran Knapper after he foolishly reacted after two strong challenges when the score was 2-1 to the Bears..

Vauxhall started last Saturday with a challenging away fixture at relegated Prescot Cables. They started well scoring after 11 minutes but were pegged back 11 minutes later and 1-1 was the final score. Last season, the Bears met Vauxhall in an early round of the Isuzu FA Trophy and ran out 3-1 winners here. In the league, the sides drew 3-3 here and Vauxhall won 2-1 at home after Max McCarthy blazed a last-minute penalty over the bar. All the matches between the two sides have been competitive and mostly closely fought so as usual, this should be a real test of the Bears progress from last season's disappointments.

Some spectators have been asking about the pitch perimeter wall after seeing information in the media from the FA regarding replacement or remedial work needed following the death of Billy Vigar playing for Chichester City in the Isthmian League last year. Congleton Town has been assessed, and work is required to enable the ground to meet the new grading specifications. The FA have offered financial assistance with work deemed necessary and the club is now in the planning stage related to timings and finances.

We are 100% supportive of the process and will be looking to have the necessary work carried out in a timely manner. The end product will be a much better safety environment for players and a much better appearance to the ground facilities.

Our next match is another home game on Saturday 15th in the Isuzu FA Trophy Preliminary Round ko 3pm against Beverley Town. As there are no replays in the FA Trophy, we will be on the road on Tuesday 18th August ko 7:45 pm as we travel to Stalybridge Celtic. For now, Saturday 22nd August is a free date (scheduled to be the FA Cup Preliminary Round).



It is highly likely that we will have a game that day as we can match up to any other team that has been eliminate and bring the scheduled match forward. Padiham is one option, but there may be other options after the FA Cup replays during this week.

We hope everyone here enjoys the match and importantly, stays safe and has a safe journey home.

STATEMENT ON SOLID PITCH SIDE BARRIERS

The FA has banned solid pitchside barriers across the National League System following the death of former Arsenal academy player Billy Vigar, the governing body said on Friday.

The FA launched a review of the safety of walls and boundaries last year after the 21-year-old suffered a significant brain injury when he hit his head on a concrete barrier beside the pitch in the Isthmian League Premier Division game while playing for seventh-tier side Chichester City.

"Any existing solid brick, breeze block or concrete barriers must be removed as soon as reasonably practicable, or covered with suitable protection if they cannot be removed for structural reasons," read the statement.

"We have informed clubs at this level that they will be required to take action as a result of these changes."

The review was conducted by independent health and safety experts for the 2026-27 season, and the FA and Premier League will provide funding to help implement the changes.

HOW IT STARTED...

For more than 60 years, Vauxhall Motors FC has been at the heart of football in Ellesmere Port. From humble beginnings in 1963 to memorable FA Cup nights and a remarkable journey back through the football pyramid, the story of the Motormen is one of ambition, resilience and unwavering community spirit.

The club was founded in 1963 following the opening of the Vauxhall Motors car plant, whose presence still overlooks Rivacre Park today. Originally representing the workforce of one of the town's largest employers, the club began life in the Ellesmere Port League before progressing into the Wirral Combination League, where it quickly established a reputation for success.

Early achievements saw Motors capture the West Cheshire League title in 1985, while an earlier move into the Northwest Counties Football League had already signalled the club's desire to climb the football pyramid. Promotion from Division Two was achieved at the first attempt, laying the foundations for greater success in the years ahead.

The move to Rivacre Park in 1987 marked the beginning of a new era. Officially opened by the legendary Sir Bobby Robson, the ground has become synonymous with Vauxhall Motors Football Club and has witnessed some of the finest moments in its history.

One of those moments came during the unforgettable 1998/99 season. The Motormen reached the Fifth Round of the FA Vase, lifted the Northwest Counties League Cup and secured promotion to the Northern Premier League. The momentum continued as the club earned promotion to the Premier Division at the first attempt before establishing itself among the strongest sides in the division.

Perhaps the greatest chapter in the club's history came under the management of Alvin McDonald. An unforgettable FA Cup campaign saw Vauxhall Motors reach the Second Round Proper, with victory over Queens Park Rangers securing the club's place in football folklore. Those magical cup runs demonstrated what could be achieved through hard work, belief and togetherness.

Promotion to the Conference North followed in 2004 under Owen Brown, taking the club to the highest level it has ever reached.

Like many clubs at non-league level, however, success was followed by significant challenges. In 2014, financial difficulties forced the club to voluntarily resign from the Conference North and return to the West Cheshire League. For many, it would have been easy to accept defeat.

Instead, Vauxhall Motors chose to rebuild.

Under Karl Bell, the foundations were laid for the club's recovery before Mick McGraa took the reins in 2018. Progress was steady and impressive, although promotion hopes were cruelly interrupted by the COVID-19 pandemic. The disappointment only strengthened the club's resolve.

Although the following campaign ended just short of another play-off challenge, the club continued to build both on and off the pitch.

The summer of 2026 has ushered in another exciting era. A landmark partnership with Premier Jet Support has brought significant investment into Rivacre Park, funding substantial improvements to the club's facilities and reinforcing its long-term ambitions.

A new voice has also taken charge in the dugout. Chris Herbert arrives following promotion with 1874 Northwich and has assembled an exciting new-look squad that has impressed throughout pre-season. With fresh energy, renewed optimism and a clear vision for the future, everyone connected with the club looks forward to what lies ahead.

As supporters gather at Rivacre Park this season, they become part of a story that stretches back over six decades. Every player who pulls on the famous white shirt, every volunteer who gives their time and every supporter who stands on the terraces contributes to the next chapter of the club's proud history.

The Motormen have overcome adversity, celebrated unforgettable triumphs and continually looked forward. Whatever the future holds, one thing remains certain—Vauxhall Motors Football Club will continue to represent Ellesmere Port with pride, passion and determination. Up The Motormen.

That perseverance was rewarded when the Motormen secured promotion before producing a superb 2022/23 campaign, winning the Northwest Counties Premier Division title and returning to the Northern Premier League Division One West.

The next chapter began in October 2023 when former Tranmere Rovers defender Danny Holmes was appointed manager. Holmes guided the club away from relegation before leading the Motormen to a fifth-place finish and a play-off semi-final in his first full season.

The Daniel Wilkinson Foundation is a charity set up in memory of Daniel Wilkinson who died in 2016 aged 24, while playing the game he loved, from an underlying heart condition called Arrhythmogenic Right Ventricular Cardiomyopathy (ARVC).



Dan played football from an early age and joined Hull City AFC when he was 10, earning a professional contract aged 18. Loughborough University followed where he completed a degree in Accounting and Financial Management while playing non-league football. He was an athlete who enjoyed the gym and took his health and nutrition very seriously. He lived life to the full and had so much ahead of him.

Other than feeling light-headed on a few occasions in the month before he died, he had no symptoms!

SUDDEN CARDIAC DEATH IN THE YOUNG (SCD)

SCD is the leading cause of death in young athletes during sport and the majority of deaths occur with **NO SYMPTOMS** or family history.

ARVC can be found in one in every 1,000 to 5,000 young adults - **IF IT IS LOOKED FOR.**

Warning signs may include light-headedness, fainting, palpitations, swollen legs, breathlessness.

Every week in the UK, 12 apparently fit and healthy young people (aged 35 and under) die from previously undiagnosed heart conditions.

In Italy, where screening is mandatory for all young people engaged in organised sport, they have reduced the incidence of young sudden cardiac death by 89%.

OUR MISSION

The Daniel Wilkinson Foundation has been set up to raise awareness of SCD and to provide funding towards heart screening, defibrillators and CPR/defibrillator training primarily for grass-roots sporting teams.

Tragedies can be prevented through cardiac screening. It is vital that young people are identified and treated.

Chris Herbert: Manager

Following the departure of Danny Holmes in the summer, Chris Herbert arrived from 1874 Northwich where he had recently won promotion to the NPL West. An experienced manager who had played and managed in the league of Wales arrives with ambition in his first season with Vauxhall Motors.

Steve Burr: Assistant Manager

Steve Burr links back up with Chris Herbert as Assistant Manager. Burr, a former manager of Hereford United and Chester FC, has vast amount of experience in the non league game.

Mark Reed: Coach

Mark Reed worked under Herbert at 1874 and was part of Mick McGrae's backroom staff at Vauxhall Motors. Reed was a former Vauxhall Motors striker of some repute.

John Keegan: Coach

John Keegan, an ex professional footballer and current Head of Football at Everton Football College, worked as Assistant Manager to Herbert in Wales many years ago and joins back up with the staff.

Mark Corbett: GK Coach

Mark Corbett, an ambassador for the highly popular GKN, and a current academy goalkeeper coach at Wigan Athletic and Everton International, brings experience in both outfield and goalkeeper coaching, also working with goalkeeper Jack Atkinson previously.

D.O.B: 21/11/2000

Previous clubs: 1874 Northwich, Wolves, Bury AFC, West Didsbury and Chorlton

Goalkeeper Atkinson returns to the club for his second spell after being part of Danny Holmes' first Motors squad. Atkinson, a former academy product of Wolverhampton Wanderers, is in between the sticks for the Motors this season.

Adam Rooney: Defender

D.O.B: 08/08/1997

Previous Clubs: City of Liverpool, Runcorn Linnetts, Nantwich Town, Atherton Collieries.

A commanding centre back, Adam Rooney re-joins the club after time away at Runcorn Linnetts and Nantwich Town, and will be a presence in Chris Herbert's side.

Vita Mbolokele: Defender

D.O.B: 03/01/1997

Previous Clubs: Brymbo, Ruthin Town and Southport.

Despite only having experience in the Welsh league, it's not taken the defender long to settle into the English footballing system. A regular for the manager last season with versatility of playing centre back and right back.

Joe Akpan: Defender

D.O.B: 26/09/2006

Previous Clubs: Rochdale

Akpan joins the club from Rochdale, where he was an academy graduate, recently playing in the National League Cup for the First Team.

Joe Ireland: Defender

D.O.B: 17/10/2007

Previous Clubs: Chester FC.

Chester FC released Joe Ireland in the summer as an 18-year old who progressed through the academy system, and has shone in pre-season for the Motormen.

Josh Solomon-Davies: Defender

Previous Clubs: Tranmere Rovers, Marine AFC and Bala Town.

The right-back played a couple of games since joining the club towards the back end of 23/24 and was part of the Semi-Final play-off defeat to Hednesford Town. He's also played in World Cup Qualifiers this summer for his country, Saint Lucia.
