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# UP THE BEARS

**A very warm welcome is extended to everyone at the Cleric Stadium today and particularly to the players, officials and supporters of AFC Wolverhampton City who have made the trip for this afternoon's Emirates FA Cup Extra Preliminary Round tie.**

Well, here we go again. After many weeks waiting, we kick off season 2026/27 with an intriguing tie against AFC Wolverhampton City, who many will recognise as the former AFC Wulfrunians when we met them in our one season in the Midland Football League (MFL). The excitement and anticipation have been growing through the close season as the Bears look to dismiss thoughts of last season in the Northern Premier League Division One West where the faithful supporters had to endure the tension of winning the last league game here, 4-0 against Trafford, and depending on Witton Albion not allowing Sporting Khalsa victory at Wincham Park for the Bears to avoid the last relegation spot (which Witton won 2-1). That followed a great first season back in the NPL the year before with a play off final place and a 2-0 defeat at a very strong Hednesford side.

It was clear that something significant was required during the close season and so it came to be that several players have left and several recruits have joined including the return of some real crowd favourites. There is more on these changes later in the programme.

Our lowly position last season sees us involved in the opening round of the Emirates FA Cup with £1125.00 in winner's prize money and £375.00 for the losing side. Today's match will last for the full 90 minutes and if the scores are level, there will be a replay on Tuesday 11th August, ko 7:45pm at AFC Wolverhampton City's Prestige Midland Arena WV3 8NA. The winners of this tie will be away to Lutterworth Town or Hereford Pegasus on Saturday 22nd August.

Our preparation for this first competitive match of the season has been six friendlies with ascending opposition's league status. Five wins and one defeat was a testament to improved team performances even with some key players absent on holiday. Last Saturday's 3-1 win here against NPL Premier Division side Bamber Bridge was most encouraging.

AFC Wolverhampton City play in the MFL Premier Division, and they at least opened their competitive season last Saturday at home to Whitchurch Alport but were beaten 2-0. They travelled to Dudley on Tuesday evening and came away with a fine 4-3 victory.

Our meetings in the MFL saw the Bears win 3-1 here and draw 0-0 at Wulfrunians. The meeting prior to that season was a remarkable Isuzu FA Vase tie where Danny Needham capitalised on a defensive error to give the Bears a 1-0 lead and Richard Duffy was sent off before half time. The second half will live long in the memory of the supporters who were there. It was virtually 45 minutes of attack and defence with Dave Parton in astonishing form, defenders blocking shots and in truth some wayward shooting from the Wulfrunians strikers. That season the Bears reached the FA Vase semi-finals and bowed out on penalties to Newport Pagnell.



If today's match is decided here, we will be at home on Tuesday 11th August ko 7:45pm when Vauxhall motors will be the visitors. That is followed by another home game on Saturday 15th in the Isuzu FA Trophy Preliminary Round ko 3pm against Beverley Town. As there are no replays in the FA Trophy, we will be on the road on Tuesday 18th August ko 7:45 pm as we travel to Stalybridge Celtic.



Welcome then to Bears supporters old and new and here's hoping you witness some good football and some exciting games this season. The omens look good.

We hope everyone here enjoys the match and importantly, stays safe and has a safe journey home.

## HOW IT STARTED...

AFC Wolverhampton City were founded in the Summer of 2025, taking on a brand-new identity from their previous name AFC Wulfrunians (founded in 2005). However, the club has over one hundred years of history behind it because today's team is an offshoot of Old Wulfrunians FC who were formed in 1922.

Having operated in the Birmingham AFA for many years, the club grew and grew and by the turn of the new millennium the strength of the club was reaching new heights. By the end of the 2004/05 season the first XI had a batch of young players who were deemed too strong for the Birmingham AFA, having done the domestic double three years in a row, and having made three appearances in the Hunt Cup final at Molineux, so the decision was taken to step up to the West Midlands (Regional) League division two under the new name of AFC Wulfrunians. With the Memorial Ground not meeting the criteria for the League, AFC Wulfs ground shared with fellow WMRL side Wolverhampton Casuals.

The first season in the West Midlands (Regional) League was an unmitigated success with the League title won by a commanding 20 points and the League Cup also safely in the trophy cabinet. In the process, a new record was set for the WMRL with just seven goals conceded in the whole season in the league. On top of this the fair play trophy was won thanks to just two bookings and no red cards throughout the entire season.

The 2006/07 season proved tougher in Division One but still a great success. A second-place finish in the league ensured promotion to the Premier Division at the first attempt while also finishing runners up in the League Cup. The major success of the season was winning the Birmingham Vase for the first time in the club's history by beating Midland Combination Division One side Stockingford AA at the Birmingham FA headquarters in Ray Hall Lane.

The club's first season in the WMRL Premier Division was also a success. As well as a fantastic top six finish, Wulfs also

managed to win the Birmingham FA Midweek Floodlit Cup, beating Bartley Green 4-0 in the Final, as well as narrowly missing out on winning the JW Hunt Cup after a last minute 3-2 loss against Wednesfield in the Final at Molineux.

The improvement continued and in the 2008/09 season AFCW won the WMRL Premier Division, only to be denied promotion due to ground grading issues. More disappointment came as another JW Hunt Cup final at Molineux was lost, this time to Bloxwich United.



The 2009/10 season was the most exciting in AFC Wulfrunians' short history. It started with the signing of a long lease on their new ground, Castlecroft Stadium, and continued with a FA Cup run that saw them reach the second qualifying round having beaten higher division opponents Boldmere St Michaels, Chasetown and Kidsgrove Athletic before eventually bowing out to Blue Square North play-off finalists Alfreton Town. The league campaign saw them eventually finish third after holding top spot for a long time. Disappointment came in the form of losing 1-0 to Bustleholme in the final of the League Cup.

The 2010/11 season brought another title challenge which ultimately ended in a third-place finish, but the club did win the JW Hunt Cup beating Gornal Athletic 3-0 in the final. Also, the Under 18's, set up just one year earlier, won the Midland Floodlit Youth League

The 2011/12 season's title challenge faded away to a 5th place finish, but more silverware came in the League Cup with a 3-2 victory over Wednesfield in the final. The final of the JW Hunt Cup was not quite as successful losing out 4-3 to Black Country Rangers at Molineux. The Under 18's finished second in the MFYL Premier North division behind Newcastle Town and lost in the final of the Birmingham FA Youth Cup at St Andrews against Birmingham City FITC.

The 2012/13 season saw manager Tim Tipton step down and he was replaced by Steve Palmer and Jon Purdie, who stepped up from running the youth team, but the success continued as they led the team to another fantastic WMRL Premier Division success. This time there were no problems and promotion was achieved.



In the Midland Football Alliance and with Steve Palmer now as sole manager, the campaign ended with a very creditable eighth place finish. Further positive news came in the shape of the club's first main sponsor as European Mezzanine Systems joined in partnership with the club.

This was followed up with an improvement to seventh at the end of the 2014/15 season. However, as the strength of the teams in the league improved for the following season, the club finished thirteenth after a disappointing second half of the season but did reach the last sixteen of the FA Vase.

The 2015/16 campaign was the most competitive since joining the league, and in the final game of the season survival was confirmed, finishing seventeenth winning fourteen of forty-two games and achieving fifty points. After four years as Manager and establishing the club in the Midland Football League, Steve Palmer stepped down - the time and effort he gave the club will never be forgotten.

Filling the role at the start of the 2017/18 season was Richard Forsyth, but after a solid start several heavy defeats made him relinquish his post as manager. Stepping into the breach for an interim period, Steve Palmer agreed to return to help the club whilst replacement options were considered, and he ensured that the league position was consolidated.

The following term started with Darren Goodall and Richard Brown as the new managerial team, with Tim Jackson added to the Coaching staff. Darren, Richard and Tim bought a wealth of experience, not just from their playing careers, but also as managers and coaches at a number of clubs and they secured a creditable twelfth place finish, one point off tenth spot.

With Tim and Richard moving on, for season 2019/2020, Scott Moore was brought in to assist Darren, with Matthew Johnson being added to the coaching staff. The following campaign, although reaching the quarter finals of the Walsall Senior Cup and the JW Hunt Cup, both competitions were curtailed due to the coronavirus as was the league programme with the team finishing thirteenth.

Following Scott Moore's departure, the Assistant managers role was taken over by Mark Jones, with Richard Gardner coming in as First team coach. Both well versed with "grassroots football".

With Darren Goodall stepping down due to work commitments, Mark Jones took over the role as manager for the start of the 2021/22 campaign with his assistant Steve Wynn. With Wynn relinquishing his position early on, Mark Smith was brought in to assist Jones with first team duties.



Jones, along with the remainder of his management team, Ben Jevons and Mat Johnson left the club in November 2021. Club stalwart Craig Gregg and captain James Hill took over the management hot seat for the interim period and following successful results on the pitch, Gregg was made permanent manager with Nick Turton returning to the club as first team coach. The duo guided the club to their best ever league finish, ending the 2021/22 campaign in a very respectable fifth place.

Season 2022/23 saw a twelfth-place finish in the league, but they reached the fifth round of the Isuzu FA Vase, the best run in the club's history, losing out narrowly by a solitary goal to Congleton Town.

Craig Gregg and Nick Turton stepped down after ten games of the 2023/24 campaign and the club moved to appoint former Gresley manager, Carl Abbott and his assistant Paul Tomlinson who guided the Wulfs to a mid-table finish to the season.

During the Summer of 2024, the club appointed former Wednesfield manager John Griffiths and his coaching team to Castlecroft. In his first season, Griffiths steered the team to victory in the Midland Football League Cup Final with a 3-1 victory over Stapenhill.

In the Summer of 2025, the club took on a brand-new identity and was renamed AFC Wolverhampton City.

The 2025/6 campaign saw City earn a play off place after equalling a record achieving fifth place league finish but lost to Northwich Victoria on penalties in the semi-final after a 1-1 draw. In their quest for another season with silverware, the holders also reached the semi-finals of the Midland Football League Cup but again suffered penalty heartbreak at the hands of Sutton United.

Despite reaching the final of the prestigious JW Hunt Cup in it's 100th anniversary of the Competition, City made it a hat-trick of penalty shoot out defeats, losing out to Dudley Town after a 1-1 stalemate at Wolverhampton Wanderers' Molineux Stadium.

**The Daniel Wilkinson Foundation is a charity set up in memory of Daniel Wilkinson who died in 2016 aged 24, while playing the game he loved, from an underlying heart condition called Arrhythmogenic Right Ventricular Cardiomyopathy (ARVC).**



Dan played football from an early age and joined Hull City AFC when he was 10, earning a professional contract aged 18. Loughborough University followed where he completed a degree in Accounting and Financial Management while playing non-league football. He was an athlete who enjoyed the gym and took his health and nutrition very seriously. He lived life to the full and had so much ahead of him.

**Other than feeling light-headed on a few occasions in the month before he died, he had no symptoms!**

## **SUDDEN CARDIAC DEATH IN THE YOUNG (SCD)**

SCD is the leading cause of death in young athletes during sport and the majority of deaths occur with **NO SYMPTOMS** or family history.

ARVC can be found in one in every 1,000 to 5,000 young adults - **IF IT IS LOOKED FOR.**

Warning signs may include light-headedness, fainting, palpitations, swollen legs, breathlessness.

Every week in the UK, 12 apparently fit and healthy young people (aged 35 and under) die from previously undiagnosed heart conditions.

In Italy, where screening is mandatory for all young people engaged in organised sport, they have reduced the incidence of young sudden cardiac death by 89%.

## **OUR MISSION**

The Daniel Wilkinson Foundation has been set up to raise awareness of SCD and to provide funding towards heart screening, defibrillators and CPR/defibrillator training primarily for grass-roots sporting teams.

**Tragedies can be prevented through cardiac screening. It is vital that young people are identified and treated.**

## WHAT IS ANDYSMANCLUB?

ANDYSMANCLUB is a free peer-to-peer group that provides a place for men to come together in a safe and open environment to talk about the issues or problems that they have faced or are currently facing.

## HOW DOES IT WORK?

The process is about bringing men together who have been in similar situations, to help each other on a peer to peer basis, sharing how they have dealt with various situations through lived experiences. No matter how big or small your problem feels, we are here to support each other. The 5 questions that are asked each week are designed not only to encourage men to talk, but to start to focus on the positives and on strategies to keep moving forward. There is no pressure to answer any of the questions and it is not uncommon for men to just listen for the first few sessions. The clubs all run on the same format and adhere to the same guidelines. A key principle of ANDYSMANCLUB is anything that is said in the club, stays within the club.

## WHO IS IT FOR?

The club is open to any man 18 or over, who is going through a storm, been through a storm or just wants to meet a good group of people with the aim of improving one another.

## WHEN IS IT?

ANDYSMANCLUB meet every Monday at 7pm (excluding Bank Holiday Mondays).
